**The new** wall-mounted version of **Calamaio** broadens the product range. Designed by Marco Cervellieri, Giulia di Lorenzo and Giacomo Montini, Calamaio comes in a new wall-mounted version with minimalist elegance, perfect for giving a contemporary touch to environments.

Calamaio's distinctive feature lies in its essential metal structure, made of two slender cylindrical stems connected by a movable pin. The LED light source, placed at the end, creates a focused beam of light that can be adjusted because of the structure's flexibility. The rotational feature of the spherical component resting on the circular base ensures perfect adaptability to different spaces. Calamaio's lightweight and flexible structure is enhanced by the bold, vivid hues of the glossy scarlet red, mustard yellow and satin black nickel lacquers.

### **New colour options**

Oluce unveils **new colour options** that will enrich its collection. Driven by innovation and aesthetic research, the brand has renewed the colour range of some of its most iconic lamps to meet the dynamic demands and trends of interior design.

The Coupé series welcomes the addition of scarlet red for the 2202 and 3321 versions, while the 3320/R and 1159/R models will maintain their unchanged elegance. The Spider range introduces a vibrant mustard yellow tone, replacing white. The Colombo collection will debut a striking scarlet red. The Canopy series will be completely renewed introducing black and scarlet red, replacing white and bronze, offering a more attractive selection that aligns with modern design trends.
